## The Nursing Home Transition Program can help.

**It's your choice.** You may be able to leave the nursing home and live at home or in another community setting. You can get services and supports to help you live in the community. The Nursing Home Transition Team can help you find housing, move and get community services and supports.

## What does the Nursing Home Transition Program do?

If you qualify for Medicaid and you think you would like to move back to the community, the Nursing Home Transition Team can help. We can give you information, evaluate your needs and help you decide.

We will meet with you, and your family if appropriate, to plan a network of services that meet your needs.

If you decide to leave the nursing home, the Transition Team will make sure you have the services you choose. We also help make sure the change goes smoothly.

Along with the Transition Team, you may have a case manager in the community. Your case manager will stay in contact with you. They will make sure you get the care and services you planned.

If you decide to return to a nursing home, the Transition Team will help with that, too.

## What services and supports are available to help you in the community?

- Help with bathing, dressing and other personal assistance
- Homemaker services for meals, shopping, laundry and light housekeeping
- Adaptive equipment, like a shower chair
- Minor home modifications, like grab bars in the bathroom
- Personal Emergency Response System
- Meals on Wheels
- Adult Day Services
- Nurses for skilled care, when needed
- Assisted Living
- Medication management
- Care coordination
- Other benefits you may qualify for
