Guiding Principles of Global Waiver

- Re-balance Long-Term Care
- Smart Purchasing
- Consumer Empowerment and Choice
- Mandatory Enrollment in Care Management
 - Enrollment into a managed care option for adults became mandatory July 1, 2009
 - Phased in enrollment on September 1, 2009 and October 1, 2009

In the Beginning...

- 2005 General Assembly session directed DHS to create managed care options for adults
- Legislation was sponsored by Governor's Commission on Disabilities
- Dozens of stakeholder meetings conducted around the state in 2006
- Began voluntary program in 2008 clients could opt-out back into fee-for-service at any time.
 - Opt-out rate was extremely low (5-7%)

Two Managed Care Options

Connect Care Choice

- A primary care case management model
- Nurse care manager on-site at participating practices
- Clients remain in Medicaid fee-forservice delivery system

Rhody Health Partners

- Health plan model
- Clients enrolled in a health plan
- Local care managers at health plan
- Other health plan functions like member services, care coordination, etc.

Connect Care Choice/ Rhody Health Partners: who can participate?

Adults on Medicaid fee-for-service who:

- are 21 years old or older
- live in the community (at home, assisted living, or group home)
- do not have other health insurance (Medicare or insurance from an employer)
- live in Rhode Island
- Categorically eligible for Medical Assistance

NOTE: Medically needy clients can enroll in CCC

Connect Care Choice: what is it?

- Primary Care Providers (PCP) create an advanced medical home by partnering with the patients to ensure all of their health care is effectively managed and coordinated
- Participating Practices link to behavioral health providers for beneficiaries with co-occurring conditions; provide screening, referral and on-going coordination.
- Participating Practices adopt e-prescribing, e-billing and computerized evidenced-based clinical decision guidelines at the point of care.
- Physicians partner with Nurse Care Managers (integrated into or dedicated to practice) to coordinate chronic care to encourage patient self-management and prevent avoidable complications

Rhody Health Partners: what is it?

- One of two health care options
- Members enroll in a participating health plan
- RHP Health Plans:
 - Neighborhood Health Plan of Rhode Island
 - UnitedHealthcare of New England

Rhody Health Partners: what is it?

- Health Plan Customer Service
 - Questions about covered benefits, finding a provider, etc.
 - Assistance in coordinating medical transportation or interpreter services
- Access to Health Plan's provider network primary, specialty and behavioral health care
- Care Management interdisciplinary team
 - Initial health screen conducted to assess unmet medical, social and behavioral health needs
 - Short-term and intensive care management to facilitate efficient use of health care services
 - Education on health conditions and use of services

Current Activities

- Anyone not enrolled in a managed care option received an enrollment letter in late July or late August with start dates 9/1/09 and 10/1/09 respectively
- Current enrollees also received an "open enrollment" letter.
- Clients may switch between programs or health plans until 12/31/09. After that time, members can switch during annual open enrollment.
