- CODAC is the oldest and largest provider of Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT) for Opioid use Disorder in Rhode Island
 - 9 Locations throughout Rhode Island
 - 1 Mobile Treatment Unit
 - 39 Clinical Counselors throughout the system
 - Treating 2500 patient at any given time in Rhode Island
 - Providing all 3 FDA approved medications to treat Opioid Use Disorder
 - Providing access to care within 24 hours / 7 days per week

Mirah Overview

- Mirah is an online platform that allows providers to use an evidence-based practice approach: measurement-based care
- Minimum of 2 decades experience ¹
- Houses over 300+ assessments in their library
- Allows for easy tracking for patient progress

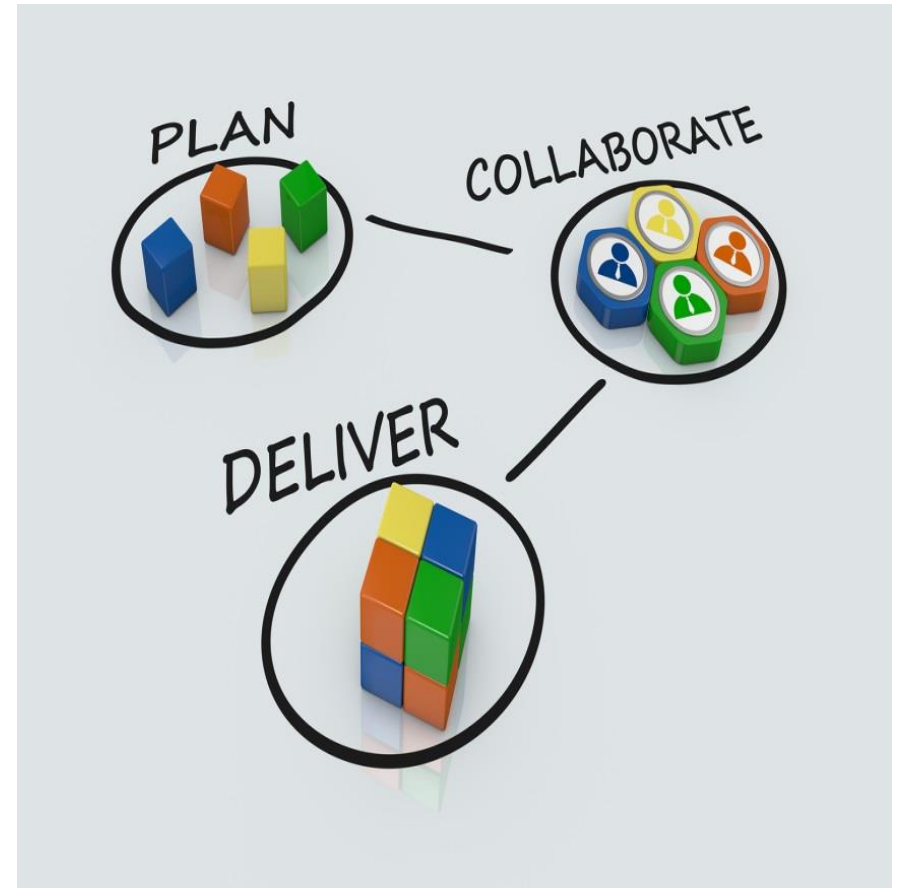

- Integrate Measurement Based Care into our Person Centered Care approach
- Provide state of the art technology for delivering and managing a battery of selected assessments
- Provide a repeatable Clinical Care training model supported by new technology

Best Practice Approach for Implementation

Project Coordination

- Establish a clear project plan based on Mirah roll out experience
- Staff the project with in-depth Codac experienced staff
- Ensure Codac Leadership involvement and governance
- Conduct weekly collaborative project meetings
- Make Clinical training the goal of all deliverables



Training Implementation

Three Rounds:

- CODAC Train the Trainers
 - 3 Staff Members to become the “experts”
- Super Users
 - Goal: At least one clinician at each of CODAC’s sites would be the go-to for staff
 - Train the trainers would be of support to super users
- All Clinical Staff
 - 2 Train the Trainers completed 3 rounds of training per week
 - Smaller intimate groups; increase interaction



Incorporated within CODAC Policy

- Highlights collaboration within the whole organization
- Outlines the minimum requirements for completing assessments through the Mirah platform

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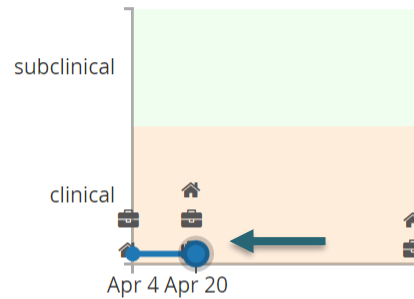

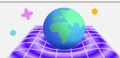

Monthly Tracking

How CODAC Monitors:

- Each month at our site director meeting the overall agency report is provided
- Each month the site director and clinical supervisor receive a monthly breakdown for each of their clinicians.
- Clinical Supervisors have been taught to bring this into their 1:1 or group supervision time
