HIT Steering Committee: Monthly Project Status (May 2023)

Project	Scope	Vendor	Funding Period	Recent Highlight
Quality Reporting System (QRS)	State-led	IMAT Solutions	Ends SFY 2024	Data is being transmitted from KIDNSET for Lead, Development Screening and Immunizations. Testing underway with completed measure development underway for these measures. Will be adding Cancer Screening measures with assistance from RIDOH.
Community Resource Platform (CRP)	State-led	Unite Us	Ends SFY 2024	Discussions are ongoing with DHS for a possible pilot of Unite Us with one or more programs. EHR Integration discussions with Prospect (Athena) have started. There were 31 additional partners (381 Total) added to the Unite RI network YTD 2023. Over 2,377 electronic referrals have been processed in YTD 2023. This is an increase of 200+ referrals from the same period last year-2022.
Health Information Exchange (HIE)	Statewide	RIQI	Approved through SFY 2023	Continuing to work with Butler Hospital to improve communication around psychiatric discharges. CurrentCare is now receiving clinical data from Sturdy Memorial Hospital and Steward Health Care located in Massachusetts.
Demographic Data Standardization	State-led	AHP, CTC	CDC Grant Ends May 2024	CTC-RI kicked off the 1st Planning Committee meeting on March 29 th . The members have been asked to provide feedback on the framework of the Environmental Scans being developed and decide on the recommended minimum standard for data collection.
Behavioral Health Record-Sharing	Statewide	N/A	N/A	The Mental Health Care Coordination bill has passed the House; Sen. McKenney is sponsoring the companion bill S719. The text for H5687 is available here: http://webserver.rilegislature.gov/BillText/BillText23/HouseText23/H5687.pdf This bill clarifies language in the state mental health law to explicitly allow record-sharing among treatment providers for patients receiving high-acuity mental health treatment services.
