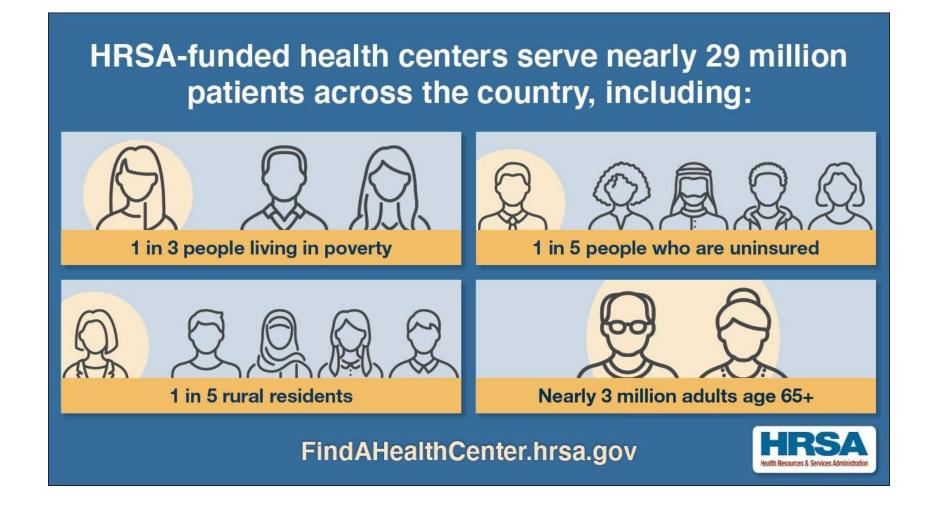

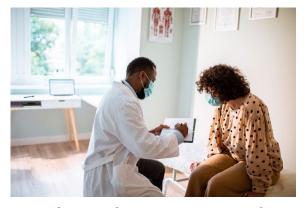

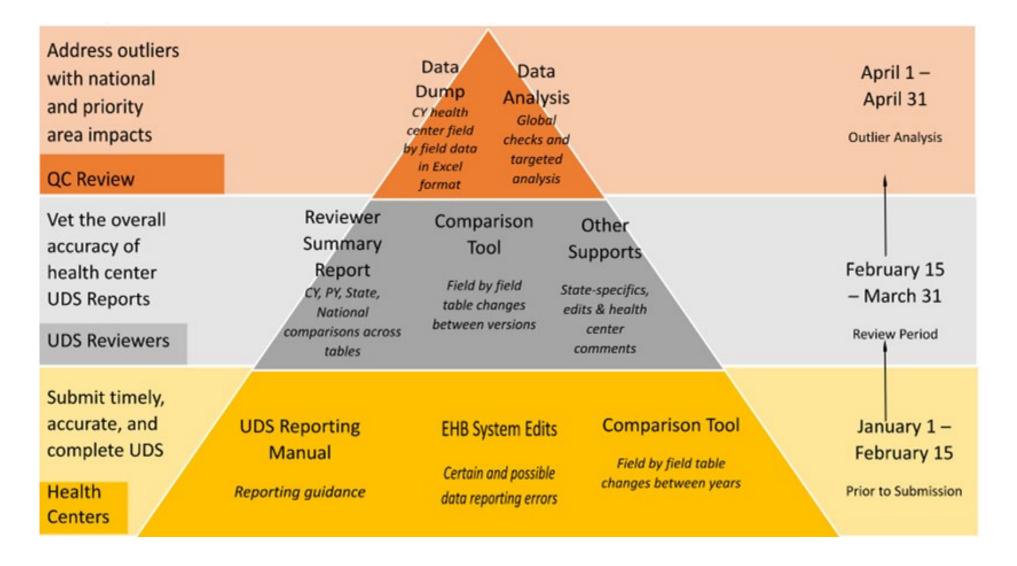

Patients

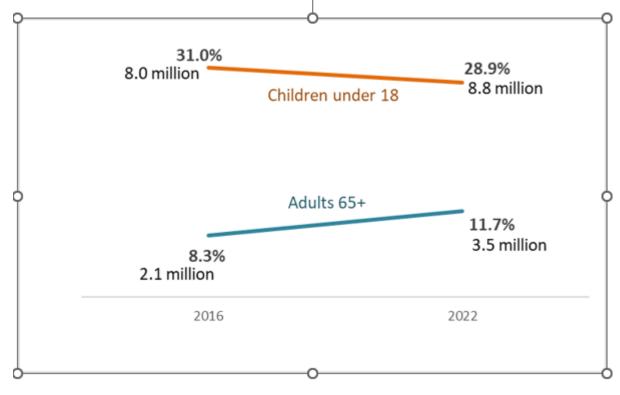
- Patient: A person who has at least one countable visit in one or more service category during the calendar year.

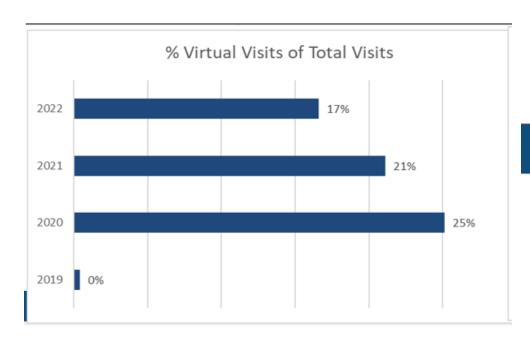

Clinical Services – Major Findings



Integrated Care

- ▶98% of health centers provided mental health (MH) services, 52% provided substance use disorder (SUD) services, and 51% provided both (as a direct service category).
- Nearly 26 million MH visits were provided by medical providers who provided MH services at medical visits or by MH personnel directly.
 - Over ½ of MH visits provided by medical providers, with nurse practitioners providing 13% of care.
- ➤ Over 7 million SUD visits were provided by medical providers who provided SUD services at medical visits, by MH providers who provided MH at MH visits, and by SUD personnel.
 - Over ¾ of SUD provided by MH or medical providers, with psychiatrists providing 12% of care.

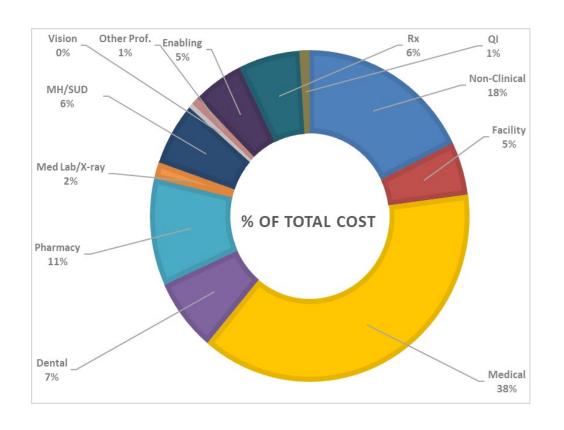

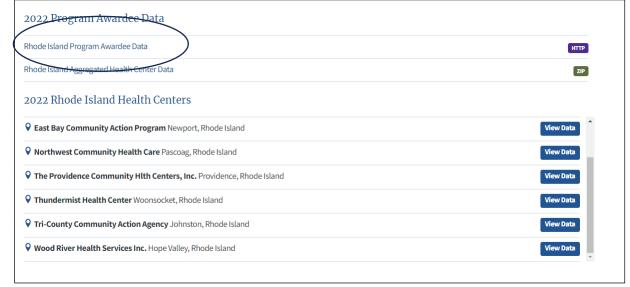
