Go live scheduled for July 2024 • Discussions underway with the State Quality Reporting team on how QRS/IMAT could assist with CMS Adult and Child Core Set Reporting requirements.

Demographic Data Standardization	State-led	N/A	CDC Grant Ends May 2024	<p>The OMB announced revisions to Standards for Maintaining, Collecting, and Presenting Federal Data on Race and Ethnicity, which apply to federal data collection and reporting. Some revisions include combining questions for race and ethnicity, adding Middle Eastern or North African as a new minimum category, and requiring the collection of additional detail beyond the minimum required race and ethnicity categories for most situations.</p> <p>The Demographic Data Collection Pilot has ended. All reports, webinars, and resources can be found here (https://ctc-ri.org/other-programs/demographic-data). CTC-RI will continue this work through the Quality Improvement initiative with 15 practices.</p>
