• Commissioner Infante-Green discussed the measures being taken to prevent COVID-19 spread in the classroom, including installing 6,100 HEPA filters and introducing COVID-19 tests for all students.

- Black and Latino populations are still overrepresented in COVID-19 case numbers.

Higher Education Update | Amy Grzybowski, Executive Director, RI Higher Education & Industry Centers, Office of the Postsecondary Commissioner

- The number of COVID-19 cases in higher education institutions is remaining consistent with the overall community case increase, indicating no further major outbreaks.
- Most higher education institutions in Rhode Island will resume remotely after Thanksgiving break.
