### **Subject: Claim Paid Date Reporting on Financial Data Reporting**

---

Dear Managed Care Organizations (MCOs),

Rhode Island Executive Office of Health & Human Services (EOHHS) is asking that all Managed Care Organizations and their Entities use the **Claim Paid Date** for paid through dates or any other reporting based on paid date when submitting financial data (FSR and FDCR) to the State. Different methodologies among MCOs have produced differences in financial data reporting and to promote consistency for reporting and EOHHS' oversight of MCOs.

The **Claim Paid Date** is defined as the date submitted on the Encounter Claims 837 file and using consistent paid date definitions across encounter and financial data allows EOHHS to balance all financial information. EOHHS would like to implement this change with January 2023 reports, which are submitted to the State by March 1, 2023.
