Summary of Rulemaking Action:

As part of theFY24 Budget, the RI legislature directed OHHS Medicaid to establish a Medicaidbuy-in program for working people with disabilities using the "Ticket toWork" federal Medicaid option.

People currentlyenrolled in the Sherlock Plan will not experience any programmatic changes whentheir program switches to be called Ticket to Work. For those already onSherlock, this will amount to a program name change and nothing more. For peopleunder age 65 who earn too much money to qualify for Sherlock, Ticket to Workmay be an opportunity to access Medicaid eligibility by paying a monthlypremium. For people over 65, the Sherlock Plan will continue in itscurrent form.

Although it has he same name, this new Medicaid eligibility program is NOT related to the Social Security Administration's Ticket to Work employment program and does not add new rules about what jobs qualify a person for Medicaid buy-in eligibility.
