



RHODE ISLAND MEDICAID PROGRAM: Health insurance for you and your family.

Medicaid helps you get affordable healthcare when you need it. You can enroll any time — but don't wait! Make sure you and your family stay healthy year-round.

Who may be eligible?

- Children and teens up to age 19 (All children are eligible under Cover All Kids, regardless of immigration status, including children who are undocumented and DACA* recipients.)
- Families with children
- Pregnant women
- Older adults
- People with disabilities
- Youth "aging out" of foster care
- U.S. citizens and certain lawfully present immigrants

If you are eligible for Medicaid, you will get coverage for:



Doctor visits



Prenatal and maternity care



Non-emergency medical transportation



Mental healthcare



Hospital stays



Medications



Preventive care: vaccines, mammograms, and colonoscopies



Vision and dental care

Your Medicaid will be managed by a trusted insurance provider like Neighborhood Health Plan of Rhode Island, Tufts Health Public Plans, or UnitedHealthcare Community Plan. Individuals with disabilities who are looking for assistance at home, in the community, or in a nursing home, can apply for Long-Term Services and Supports (LTSS).

* Deferred Action Childhood Arrivals

Eligibility may depend on your income, number of people in your household or disability status. Even if you were previously not eligible, you may now qualify. The Medicaid program will review your application and tell you if you are eligible.

How do I apply for Medicaid?

Anyone can apply through the RI Department of Human Services (DHS)
