Summary of Rulemaking Action:

In response to emerging concerns related to potentialfraud, waste, and abuse (FWA) and the health and safety of Medicaidbeneficiaries, the Rhode Island Executive Office of Health and Human Services(EOHHS) is proposing updates to the Community Health Worker (CHW) program tostrengthen oversight, safeguard beneficiary health and safety and Medicaidfunds, and ensure the continued integrity of the program.

EOHHS has identified a need to enhance providerscreening and improve documentation and billing standards to better align withfederal and state program integrity requirements. As part of this effort, CHW providers will be designated as high-risk providers for the purposes of enrollment, which will include additional screening measures to protect thehealth and safety of Medicaid members and promote the appropriate use of Medicaid resources.
