

Year 2 RI CCBHC Certification Standards: Addendum 11
September 16, 2025

The purpose of this addendum is to formally codify the below modifications and clarifications to the Year 2 RI CCBHC Certification Standards. All other certification requirements and conditions in the [RI CCBHC Certification Standards for Program Year 2](#) issued on January 28, 2025 and the [Addendum 10](#) issued on June 11, 2025 remain in effect.

Addendum 5: Populations of Focus Diagnostic and Assessment Criteria

Individuals in the SUD population must be re-evaluated every 90 days utilizing the ASAM assessment to determine if they continue to need this level of service intensity.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Addition of two additional qualifying diagnoses: (1) cocaine related disorders; and (2) inhalant related disorders. • Transition from use of condition names to a defined list of ICD-10 diagnostic codes. This list comprehensively reflects all allowable diagnoses. There is <u>no</u> anticipated need of a ‘CCBHC SUD Population Exception Request’ form and process. • Removal of the ASAM score threshold of 2.1 or higher as an SUD population eligibility requirement. Note, an ASAM assessment is still required for all individuals within this population. The resultant initial assessment score and all reassessment scores must be documented within each individual’s EHR record and/or care plan. This will be monitored by the State via record reviews.
