## What do we know about the Healthcare Workforce in Rhode Island?

Healthcare occupations = Standard job types, regardless of sector (e.g., school nurse)

Healthcare sector/industry = Standard employer types, regardless of occupations (e.g., food server in a hospital)



#### Healthcare Industry in Rhode Island

#### As of the 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter of 2021

- The Healthcare and Social Assistance sector employs 76,600 workers in RI, or 18.6% of the total private sector workforce in RI. It is the single biggest sector of employment in RI
  - 6.6% of the RI workforce is employed in Ambulatory Healthcare Services
  - 5.5% of the RI workforce is employed in Hospitals
  - 3.5% of the RI workforce is employed in Nursing and Residential Care Facilities
  - 2.8% of the RI workforce is employed in Social Assistance
- The average annual wage for this sector is \$54,000; the average annual wage for the RI workforce as a whole
  is \$58,800
  - Hospitals and Ambulatory Health Care Services have a higher annual median wage than the rest of the RI workforce
- A projected 85,100 positions in Healthcare will be/will need to be filled between 2018-2028



### Impact of COVID on the Healthcare and Social Assistance Sector


- During the pandemic related shutdown, this sector lost 17,400 jobs, accounting for over one-fifth of the sector's employment
- Several industries within this sector were totally or partially impacted by the social distancing guidelines, as Day Care Centers were ordered closed, medical appointments were limited to telephone and video interviews, and elective surgeries were cancelled
- Through February 2022 the sector has regained 13,200 jobs, about three-quarters of the jobs lost during the shutdown
- Ambulatory Heath Services is the only industry group within the sector to have regained all the jobs lost and is now has 1,300 more jobs than it did in February 2020



#### **Healthcare Occupational Projections through 2028**


These are among the healthcare occupations with the most projected demand. Nursing Assistants and RNs will continue to be in high demand.


Job Openings by Occupation and Type of Opening (exits vs. transfers)



#### **Demographics of Healthcare Workers**

Compared to the total private sector workforce in the U.S., the Healthcare and Social Assistance sector employs fewer workers under age 25, more workers between 25-34, and far more women than men.








#### Demographics of Workers in the Healthcare Industry

Compared to the total private sector workforce in the U.S., the Healthcare and Social Assistance sector employs workers with more education. Race/ethnic distribution is similar although Healthcare employs more Black workers.








#### **Demographics across Occupational Groups**

Healthcare Support Occupations are generally lower-paid than Healthcare Practitioners and Technical Occupations and more diverse in terms of race and ethnicity.

# What is Rhode Island Doing to Prepare the Healthcare Workforce?



#### Real Jobs RI Healthcare Industry Job Placements

Since 2016, a total of 1,953 people have been placed into jobs within the Healthcare and Social Assistance sector through Real Jobs RI programs. The majority of placements have taken place in the last 3 years.

- Approximately 700 participants were placed with nursing, rehabilitation, hospice, or home care agencies.
- Sixty percent of people were placed into full-time jobs (35+ hours/week).
- The average wage for full-time workers was \$35,443.
- 73% of people were placed into Healthcare Support Occupations or Healthcare Practitioners and Technical Occupations.
