COVID-19 Vaccine Distribution Strategy Update | Rhode Island Department of Health (RIDOH) Director Dr. Nicole Alexander-Scott

- The main factor hindering rapid vaccine distribution to all Rhode Island adults continues to be lack of vaccine supply on the federal level.
- Vaccination rates in High Density Communities (HDCs) continue to be lower than non-HDCs.
- RIDOH is working through multiple channels to improve vaccination accessibility in High-Density Community (HDC) zip codes. This includes designating specific days for HDCs at mass vaccination sites, eliminating age restrictions for HDC zip codes, and working with retail pharmacies in HDC zip codes.
