# COVID-19 Vaccine Distribution Strategy Update | High-Density Community (HDC) Leads Sheena Gordon and Julian Drix

- The Rhode Island Department of Health is working with Equity Council members to establish equity-focused vaccination clinics on April 10<sup>th</sup> and 11th, and April 17th and 18th.
- People of color have had a faster decrease in hospitalization rates since the last COVID-19 surge, although the disparity in cases and hospitalizations between individuals of color and white populations persists.

# Community Feedback: What are you hearing from the community? What should the State know?

- Members discussed the possibility of implementing mobile vaccination sites.
