COVID-19 Vaccine Distribution Update – Rhode Island Department of Health (RIDOH) team

- RIDOH Medical Director Dr. James McDonald addressed the CDC's halt of the distribution of the Johnson and Johnson vaccine, and thoroughly explained the clinical issues leading to this action.

Equity-focused Vaccination Clinics – Pastor Howard Jenkins and Dr. Luis-Daniel Muñoz

- 2,637 individuals were vaccinated through the Equity Focused Vaccination clinics on April 10th and 11th. This total includes both individuals that pre-registered and walk-in attendees.
- Equity Council members who organized and participated in the equity-focused vaccination events shared their insights about the operations and outcomes of the weekend's clinics, as well as areas of improvement for next weekend's clinics.
