These regulations are being promulgated pursuant to the authority contained in R.I. Gen. Laws Chapter 40-8 (Medical Assistance); R.I. Gen. Laws Chapter 40-6 ("Public Assistance"); R.I. Gen. Laws Chapter 42-35; and Title XIX of the Social Security Act.

## 210-RICR-40-05-2 Community Medicaid: Medically Needy Eligibility

The Secretary of the Rhode Island Executive Office of Health and Human Services (EOHHS) has under consideration an amendment to the Medicaid regulations entitled, 210-RICR-40-05-2 Community Medicaid: Medically Needy Eligibility.

This amendment is being promulgated to reflect updated guidance from the federal government related to Medicaid eligibility during the PHE. The federal government has clarified that Medicaid beneficiaries may be moved within tiers of coverage during the PHE and this amendment adds language to clarify that medically needy ABD Medicaid beneficiaries will only have their coverage extended if they are not enrolled in another tier 1 coverage. If they are enrolled in another tier 1 coverage their medically needy coverage will end at the end of their 6 month coverage period and they will switch to the other tier 1 coverage for which they are eligible.

Laws 42-35-2.8(c), an opportunity for a hearing will be granted if a request is received by twenty-five (25) persons, or by a governmental agency, or by an association having not less than twenty-five (25) members, within ten (10) days of this notice that is posted in accordance with R.I. Gen. Laws 42-35-2.8(a). A hearing must be open to the public, recorded, and held at least five (5) days before the end of the public comment period.
